PROPOSITION 28 PLAN for Gold Oak Union School District

2023-24 Projected Allocation Gold Oak Union School District: \$65,000

Background:

On November 8, 2022, California voters approved Proposition 28: The Arts and Music in Schools Funding Guarantee and Accountability Act (AMS). The measure requires the state to establish an ongoing program supporting arts instruction in schools beginning in the 2023-2024 school year. The amount of funding available each fiscal year for the AMS program will be one percent of the K-12 portion of the Proposition 98 funding guarantee provided in the prior fiscal year, excluding funding appropriated for the AMS program.

Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) with more than 500 pupils must expend at least 80% of the funds to employ certificated or classified employees to provide arts education and the remaining funds for training supplies, curriculum, professional learning, materials, and arts educational partnership programs.

Each school is required to submit an annual board- approved report to be posted on the school district's and Department of Education's websites that details the types of arts education programs funded by the program; the number of full-time equivalent teachers, classified personnel, and teaching aides; the number of pupils served; and the number of school sites providing arts education programs with such funds.

Expenditure Plan

Gold Oak Union School District is projected to receive **\$65,000** of Proposition 28 funding for the 2023-2024 school year and will be spent in the 2024-2025 school year. Expenditures in future years will reflect adjustments to annual allocations of Proposition 28 fundings from the State of California. With the funds received, Gold Oak Union School District intends to execute the following actions:

Hire Credentialed Art Teacher	Hire a credentialed Art teacher to provide art instruction to all students in the District at both school sites.	\$60,000
Materials and equipment needed	Purchase art supplies and equipment.	\$5,000

Gold Oak Union School District Proposition 28 Plan Approval

Guidance provided by the California Department of Education articulates that schools may pool resources to help facilitate inter-school programs.
